I refer to previous discussions in PSC and COTER, and the references within the EU Strategic Compass for Security and Defence (endorsed by Heads of State and Government in March 2022) and the Foreign Affairs Council Conclusions on Addressing the external dimension of a constantly evolving terrorist and violent extremist threat (of June 2022) to increase the Network of Counter Terrorism/Security Experts in EU Delegations.

In this context, I am pleased to inform you that we are seeking applications from Member States for a <u>"co-financed"</u> National Expert (SNE) for secondment as **CT/Security Expert at the EU Delegation in Morocco** pursuant to the Decision of the High Representative of 4th February 2014 establishing the rules applicable to SNEs¹.

The Network of CT/Security Experts is a key element of the EU's counter terrorism and security toolbox and an important means through which the EU's external CT and security policy is implemented.

The secondment is foreseen for a period of **2 years** (with a possibility of extension).

Could you kindly forward the enclosed job description to the various relevant Ministries in order to elicit applications from well-qualified candidates.

Applications must include a copy of the candidate's CV, along with a motivation letter. The motivation letter should set out the candidate's reasons for applying, as well as the skills and qualities s/he would bring to the role.

Consequently, possible applicants should be informed that their CVs will be circulated to EEAS services involved in the selection and management of their possible secondment as well as within the Delegation concerned.
